1981	The New River City Wind Ensemble, which will later become the Austin Symphonic Band, is founded by a group of Austin Civic Orchestra musicians looking for a group to perform wind music when there are more wind musicians than ACO can accommodate. ACO helps the nascent group with organizational details and rehearsal space. First Music Director is R. Frank Simon.	about August 1981
1982	Band adopts the name Austin Symphonic Band	
	Frank Simon leaves to take a position at the UT Performing Arts Center. David Parker becomes interim conductor.	about June 1982
1983	Randol Bass, now a nationally-known composer and arranger of music, becomes ASB's second Music Director.	about January 1983

1984	The Austin Symphonic Band incorporates on April 26, 1984. Receives 501-(c)3 status from IRS.
